- 8. What kind of transformation will be necessary for lions to eat straw like cattle or the ox?
- 9. How do you explain **Isaiah 11:4**?
- 10. **Divine "Magnet"** Gen. 9:13–17; Isa 1:10–15; 2:2–4; 66:1-19; Ezek. 8:7–12 What is a magnet? How is God a magnet?
- 11. What kind of person "trembles" at God's word?
- 12. Why does God lament that things were not going the way they should have been going? Look at 2 Kings 17:18-20.
- 13. What do you think about **Isaiah 66:3?** What is God condemning?
- 14. What is the outcome that happened to Judah and Jerusalem?
- 15. In the lesson the question is "How does God serve as a magnet to draw the nations to Himself?"
- 16. Is **Isaiah 66:12** a present time event or a future time event and why do you think this?
- 17. God is a God of Love but look at **Isaiah 66:13**. How do you reconcile this verse?
- 18. Missionaries and Worship Leaders Isa. 66:19–21; Exo 19:6; Num. 8:11; Matt. 23:15; Col. 1:23; Rom. 12:1; 1 Peter 2:9, 10 Where does God go with His message that has been rejected by those who want to follow their own desires?
- 19. Do you see yourself as that identified missionary going out to people who do not know about God? If not, why not?
- 20. What about the kindred from all nations? Will Jews not like that? 1 Peter 2:9, 10 then compare Revelation 5:9-10
- 21. Community of Faith Isa. 66:21; Exod. 19:6; Matt. 28:19; Acts 26:20; Rom. 3:2, 11:17-18; Gal. 3:28-29; Col. 3:11; 1 Tim. 3:16; 1 Pet. 2:9 What was the original position for the Israel nation? Were they faithful?
- 22. Doesn't this suggest that all men and women were created equal in God's sight and that all are called to be a part of the royal priesthood?
- 23. Did any of the Jews living in Jerusalem complain about these ideas when they first heard them from Isaiah? Rom. 11:17-18
- 24. **So Shall Your Seed and Your Name Remain** Was Isaiah remembering what had happened to the Assyrians outside Jerusalem? What was done with 185,000 dead bodies?
- 25. Didn't Christ's message of Matthew 13:24-30 where the farmer tells his workers to leave the wheat with the tares? Look at Isaiah 66:24 again.
