2. Paul had a long journey during his life. Would you have used Odysseus vs. us or Odysseus vs. Paul? Why?
3. Do we have to suffer to earn our way back? Why or why not?
4. How do we earn salvation?
5. Are you glad Jesus' righteousness is credited to you?
6. **Reflections of Calvary – Galatians 6:14** What was special about Calvary? Can you name five things?
7. Who can measure the love Christ felt for a lost world as He hung upon the cross, suffering for the sins of guilty men?
8. 'My God, My God, why hast Thou forsaken Me?' How does that make you feel knowing your sins caused God to shun Jesus?
9. **True or False** - If we are saved only by a credited righteousness, not something that exists within us, then it doesn't matter what we do or how we act.
10. **The Covenant and the Sacrifice Rom 6:23; 1 Peter 1:18-19; 1 John 5:11, 13** Are you saved? How do you know you are saved?
11. Looking at **1 Peter 1:18-19**: What did Peter mean when he said we "were ransomed"? Why is that?
12. Was it because God was incapable of fulfilling His end of the deal? Or, was He just unwilling to do so?
13. What was stronger in death to Christ?
14. So, who decided how serious this debt was? And what should be paid?
15. **The Faith of Abraham: Part 1 Gen 15:6; Rom 4:1–7, 16** What the most important point in **Genesis 15:6**?
16. Was Abraham's righteousness in the sense of God's righteousness?
17. What did Abraham do that helps us understand why this righteousness was credited to him, opposed to what he was?
18. Was it foolish for Abraham to believe God's promise of a son by Sarah when Abraham was 100 and when Sarah was 90 and beyond having children?
19. What saves us; righteousness by faith, justification is by faith or sanctification by faith?
20. **The Faith of Abraham: Part 2 Gen 15:6, 31:15, Lev. 7:18, 17:1–4; Num. 18:27, 30** Why did Rachel and Leah think they thought of as strangers?
21. How is the idea of reckoning, counted, or regarded used when referred to sacrifices?
22. Despite our faults, sins, and shortcomings, Jesus accounts us as righteous in God's sight. How does that fact affect your response to Jesus in your life?
23. What does a King impute to His subjects?
24. **Resting on the Promises Ps. 34:8; Matt. 11:30; Rom. 5:1; Phil. 2:7, 8** How can you taste God's goodness?
25. What is it about what Christ has done for us that makes this yoke easy?
26. What does justification have to do with peace?
